Dr Avijit Banerjee



Dr. Avijit Banerjee qualified in Dentistry from Guy's Dental School, London, UK in 1993. After completing his Masters and a PhD in Cariology from Univ. College London and gaining Fellowship of the Dental Faculty of the Royal College of Surgeons (Eng) he entered clinical academia as a lecturer in Conservative Dentistry at his alma mater. Over the past decade he has gained an international reputation in lecturing, teaching and publishing widely in the research fields of Cariology, minimally invasive operative dentistry (including bio-active glass air-abrasion) and adhesive dental biomaterials. He currently holds a Readership in Cariology & Operative Dentistry and Hon. Consultant in Restorative Dentistry at King's College London Dental Institute at Guy's Hospital, London as well as a Visiting Chair in Restorative Dentistry, Oman Dental College, Oman. As Deputy Director of Education (Clinical Skills) he is involved with UG and PG curriculum development. He is the primary author of Pickard's Manual of Operative Dentistry - 9th ed (Oxford University Press, 2011) and is on the editorial board of Dental Update as well as holding international examinerships in Oman and Brunei. He collaborates with international dental industry on their R&D programmes for operative technologies and materials pertinent to Minimally Invasive (MI) Dentistry. His clinical interest at the Hospital lies in the oral/dental rehabilitation of head and neck cancer victims and he continues to maintain part-time sessions in practice as a specialist in Restorative Dentistry, Prosthodontics and Periodontics.



Professor Panos N Papapanou

Panos N. Papapanou, DDS, PhD is Professor of Dental Medicine, Director of the Division of Periodontics, and Chairman of the Section of Oral and Diagnostic Sciences, Columbia University College of Dental Medicine, New York, USA. He received his DDS from the University of Athens, Greece, his PhD from Göteborg University, Sweden, and his post-doctoral training at the Forsyth Institute, Boston, MA. His research includes studies of the epidemiology of periodontal disease, the assessment of microbial and host-derived risk factors, the pathobiology of periodontitis and its role in systemic health outcomes. He is the recipient of the Jens Waerhaug Research Prize (1988, Scandinavian Society of Periodontology); the Anthony A. Rizzo Young Investigator Award (1996, IADR); the Walther-Engel Award (1998, Academy for Graduate Dental Education, Karlsruhe, Germany); the Clinical Research Award (2007, American Academy of Periodontology); and the Global Award in Periodontal Medicine (Sunstar, 2009). He is Associate Editor of the Journal of Clinical Periodontology and board member of several journals, a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, and Past President and currently Councilor of the Periodontal Research Group of the IADR.
